By learning the language of content, all students will unlock their full potential. We don't just believe this. We have evidence!


What Does Speak Agent Do?

Home Page




The **Home** page shows year-to-date statistics about your students.

- **Activities and Lessons.** Most lessons have 5-10 activities. A lesson is only "done" when all of the required activities are completed. (You decide which are required.)
- Words Learned. These are the vocabulary terms connected to your curriculum.
- Portfolio Items. All expressive language activities save and store student work.
- Your Students. Click a student's name or class to drill into more details!



Finding a Lesson



- O Click this icon to preview the lesson.
- Click this icon to share a link to the lesson.
- Indicates a lesson you have favorited.
- A lesson recently added by Speak Agent.

Organization Lessons. This tab has all the digital lessons that have been mapped to your district's curriculum. You have access to lessons for all subjects and grade levels. Your students have access only to lessons that you assign to them.


Lessons You Made. This tab has lessons that you have created or copied. Take our PD course 201: Differentiating Instruction if you wish to create your own lessons.

Enrichment. This tab contains enrichment lessons for heritage months and events.

- To find a lesson, search by keyword, narrow by subject, and/or narrow by grade.
- When keyword searching, just type one word and press the Enter or Return key on your keyboard. You don't need to type in the whole lesson name!
- For example: Just type "ratios" instead of "Applying Ratios and Rates."
- **Pro Tip.** Press **Reset** to start your search over without any filters.



Saving Favorites



Check this box to filter to just your favorites list.

- Click this icon to favorite a lesson.
- Indicates a lesson you have already favorited.

Favorites. When you favorite a lesson, that will make it easier to find later. You won't have to search every time you need it. Just press the \(\circ\) icon next to a lesson to favorite it.


Un-favoriting. To remove a lesson from your favorites list, just press the vicon.

Searching for Favorites. Just check the box to the left of "Title." But remember that search filters are cumulative. So, if you can't find a favorited lesson, make sure you don't have any search filters on.

Pro Tip. Press **Reset** to start your search over without any filters.



- **Assign.** See page 9 for how to assign the lesson to your classes and students.
- **Preview.** Press Preview to get a sneak peek of the lesson as a student or to run a whole class activity. Activities in Preview will not save data or progress.
- **View Wordlist.** View the vocabulary that students will learn in this lesson.
- **Print Lesson Details.** Creates a printer-friendly version of this page.
- **Print Word Wall.** Creates a PDF of the vocabulary with visual aids.



Previewing a Lesson



Why Preview? This feature lets you experience the activities as a student and run the activities from your computer or interactive whiteboard.

Starting Preview. There are two ways to start previewing. Both will open the preview in a new browser tab.


- Go to a lesson and press the Preview button (shown above).
- Find a lesson and press the ② shortcut (as shown on page 5).

Ending Preview. To close the preview, just close the browser tab.

Does Preview Collect Data? No. In order for data to be collected, students need to do the activities in their own student accounts.



Assigning a Lesson




Delivery Date. Choose when the lesson will become available to your students.

Due Date. Optionally, set a deadline for students to finish the lesson. If they are late, they can still do the work but you will see an "overdue" flag in the class report.

Required? Uncheck a box to make that activity a "bonus activity" that does not need to be done in order to complete the lesson.



Viewing Reports





Indicates that an activity is complete.



Click this icon to view the student's portfolio.



Click to view the student's score history for all activity attempts.



Indicates that a student did not finish the assignment by the due date.

Class Progress. This tab (shown above) shows the progress that your class is making with one Speak Agent lesson.

- To open a class report, go to the class page and click the title of a lesson.
- To update the report, press the cicon in the top-right corner of the page.
- To drill down into a student's report, click the name of the student.

Words. This report shows class progress with the unit vocabulary. You can mouse over a progress bar to see which students still need to learn each concept.

Level Up. This report gives you the results of the end-of-lesson Level Up formative assessment. You can see what % of the class answered correctly and what were the most common misconceptions.
